Parking Lot Repair and Matching Opportunity

Over the decades, First Lutheran, with large investment of funds and effort, has secured the wonderful parking spaces we enjoy today. Imagine that as late as 1985 there was no parking lot to the south of the church. As with our homes that require painting and upkeep, so to do our parking lots.

All three lots require a topcoat to extend their life, and small areas that have broken down need to be cut out and replaced with new asphalt. When finished, the lots will be restriped. This work will extend the life of the lots whose replacement cost is upwards of half-million dollars.

The Finance, Property, and Administration board has received bids and worked hard to find a quality contractor. The total cost will be approximately \$40,000. We plan to have the work done in late spring. The good news, besides the lengthening of the lots' life, is that a challenge grant of \$20,000 has been pledged that will double your contribution to the project. Our hope is that with strong congregational participation, we can use the full match, and the resurfacing can be covered—freeing the board's budget to be invested in other critical needs of our buildings.

Please prayerfully consider a gift, designating "parking lot" in the memo line. We are grateful for the dedicated staff and volunteers who give of their time and talents to keep First Lutheran Church a welcoming home.

Lowell Elementary – Neighborhood Soccer League

Spring is coming, and so is the spring soccer season! Lowell Neighborhood Soccer is ready to "roll." The spring season is scheduled for April 20 – May 18. The Lowell Soccer team practices each Saturday morning at Campus Park. in soccer and building sportsmanship and character.

Ministry and Board Updates

January Council Updates

Reports

Thank You. Michael began by thanking Council members and

staff for the work done this past year. This is his final Council meeting, and he expressed appreciation to all who gave time and talents to FLC in their leadership roles.

Transition. Michael announced that the Executive Committee will have two new members elected at the annual meeting.

Annual Meeting. The annual meeting will be Sunday, February 4, at 12:15 p.m.

Financial Report. Randy reported that November and December income were down, but income overall in 2023 was good. The average gift per giving unit is \$3,043.

Pastor Jason. Regarding the discussion about a third pastor, the overall design is to call an Evangelism and Outreach pastor. He and Pastor Tom will address this issue and cover the needs for the congregation. The pastors and staff are working on a theme for Lent, "Hymns of Our Faith." The Bible study on the Gospel of Mark has begun.

Pastor Tom. He states it has been delightful hearing what FLC is involved in, and he has had an awesome welcome from the congregation. He asks: Where are the needs? There are many.

Communication. It is important we stress we are *pausing* on the search for a third pastor, not ceasing.

Action

Proposed Budget for 2024. Michael began with an explanation of designated funds versus restricted accounts. The

Executive Committee looked at both funds when preparing the budget for 2024. The total FLC budget for 2024 is \$2,026,572. This amount is \$35,838 below the anticipated income of \$1,990,734 for an overall loss.

Several boards have amounts in their restricted accounts that apply to and cover the board's requests for 2024 without totally depleting all funds in the restricted accounts. Where applicable for those boards, funds were taken from the restricted accounts to fund the board's operating budget requests. For example, the Care & Health Board has sufficient restricted funds to fully fund all line items in the budget request except the Project CAR line item. Consequently, the Care & Health Board budget line items will be funded with money from restricted accounts plus \$3,158 for Project CAR.

Men in Mission, WELCA, and the Quilters each operate independently and are not part of the FLC annual budget.

Church Mutual has canceled property and casualty insurance for FLC. A new policy has not yet been obtained. In the interim, Acuity Insurance provides general liability, umbrella insurance protection, and auto coverage for the truck. The cost of the insurance premium for 2024 is unknown at this time and is not included in the 2024 budget.

All parking lots (except the Starbucks lot) will be resurfaced in 2024. This will be paid for using the Foundation gift to the Property Board from three years ago.

The Stewardship benevolence to the SD Synod in 2022 was \$55,000 (2.7%) and in 2023 and 2024 was and is \$76,000 (4.0%). Mason questioned if the Council should establish a formula for setting the amount given to the SD Synod each year. The Stewardship Board was asked to bring

forth a recommendation for Council's consideration.

At the current rate of giving by the congregation, FLC cannot fund a third pastor. Therefore, the Call Committee is pausing (not ceasing) its search for a third pastor to join the staff. Pastor Jason and Pastor Tom will divide duties and see what does not get done. To keep with transparency, we must be honest with the congregation. We must educate our members that it is important to increase the number of giving units in the congregation to generate more income. If we go forward with calling a third pastor, we must be able to sustain that pastor in the years to come.

The total proposed budget is \$2,026,572. Anticipated (pledged) income is \$1,990,734. There is a carryover from 2023 of \$128,262. This creates a surplus of \$92,424, and it is hoped this sum will cover the cost of the property and casualty insurance premium when it is purchased. If it does not, FLC may have to increase the deductibles on the policy to get a lower premium cost.

At the conclusion of the budget discussion, Lori and Chris moved that the budget for 2024 be approved and presented to the congregation at the annual meeting. The motion was unanimously approved.

Authorization. It was moved by Lyle, seconded by Deb, that the Council authorize use of the sum of \$117,078.09 received as a 100-year anniversary gift from the foundation for resurfacing the parking lots in 2024 and for an awareness project in 2024. The motion carried. Committees need to be established. Recruiting volunteers for the awareness committee will be discussed at next month's Council meeting. The goal is for outreach and attracting more giving units.

Family sessions have now been established to give grieving children, adolescents, and their family caretakers a chance to process the life changes they have experienced since a loved one's passing.

The next four-week grief therapy session begins on Monday, April 8, and continues

the following three Mondays at Our Savior's Lutheran Church. All sessions begin with a free meal at 5:30 before breaking into elementary, adolescent. and adult groups ending at 7:30.

April Special Offering: St Dysmas of South Dakota

"And Jesus said,

your way..." John 8: 11

Greetings from your Sisters and Brothers in Christ behind the walls and bars of the South Dakota State Penitentiary!

St Dysmas of South Dakota is your ministry that provides worship opportunities, Bible study, and pastoral care for people incarcerated in the penitentiary system in South Dakota.

St Dysmas Lutheran Church is the congregation that gathers inside the penitentiary—on Wednesday afternoons in Sioux Falls on "The Hill"; on Tuesday evenings at Mike Durfee State Prison in Springfield, SD (35 miles west of Yankton, SD); and on Sunday evenings at the Yankton Minimum Unit on the state hospital campus in Yankton, SD.

The people who come to St Dysmas wake each day held by consequences of

the worst decision or action they ever had in their life. But when they get out of the chaos of the prison, away from what prison tells them they are, and come to worship, they are seen as God's children. They hear that they are not only redeemable but have been redeemed in Jesus Christ.

In 2023, we worked with 574 individuals who attended worship, Bible study, or had pastoral care one-on-ones. The work we do together impacts lives in a profound way. The freedom and forgiveness known in Jesus Christ is a powerful gift of faith for those experiencing incarceration. We baptized 31 adult men in 2023 and celebrated affirmation of baptism for 3 men. It is not good to cry in prison, but I watched these men, overcome with emotion, be claimed in a promise that told many of them for the first time in their lives that they are known, loved, and valued.

St Dysmas also offers re-entry accompaniment for those individuals being released from prison who need help transitioning back into productive lives. We provide Re-Entry Classes for those set to be released in the next year, and we partnered with 156 men when released

to connect them to resources. We partner with halfway houses and agencies across the state, and even sometimes out-of-state, to help people restart productive and successful lives.

St Dysmas and First Lutheran Church have had a long-standing partnership. Groups of visitors routinely come to worship with us in Sioux Falls, and you have continued to be very generous in your financial support. We do not exist without you; it is as simple as that. We can never be self-sustaining. It is congregations, families, and individuals like you who make this ministry possible.

Your partnership with St Dysmas truly changes peoples' lives, and above all, makes the gospel of Jesus Christ known to those who are often forgotten or viewed as undeserving. Thank you for committing to this partnership that makes new life in Christ possible.

Capital Campaign Updates

As you may know, First Word articles are written weeks in advance of your receiving either a copy in the mail or

an electronic version.

I am writing this article on Friday, March 1. Here is what I can share about capital campaign projects.

The removal of wallpaper in the Gathering Room, Trinity Room, and Luther Lounge has been completed. These three rooms have been painted the same color as the Atrium. The artwork in the Gathering Room will not be put back up until after the asbestos abatement is completed. The abatement was approved by the Church Council Thursday, February 29. The

abatement start date will be either March 11 or March 18. The Gathering Room will be closed for several weeks once this project starts.

Mid-States has been here Since February 19. They are working in so many areas of the church pulling cables for the new sound and video systems. Mid-States usually works four days a week; however, they have been working Fridays until late afternoon since they are unable to be in the Sanctuary on Wednesday after 5 p.m. due to the mid-week Lenten services. Things are going well on the sound and video update. Thanks to those of you who come to the 11:15 mid-week service in the Chapel. We recognize it is cozy, but the staff appreciates your patience while Mid-States is working on the new sound and video systems.

No news on the Bell Tower and Steeple project cost yet. The company in Wisconsin continues to tell us they will get the bid to us shortly, but we don't get anything. Unfortunately, this is the third company we have tried to get a bid from for the bell tower and steeple.

The Church Council voted to reengage Architecture, Inc. to prepare the construction plans for the new entrance to the sanctuary and the changes to the restrooms in the Welcome Center. It will take Architecture, Inc. approximately six months to prepare the construction plans. In the meantime, a committee was put together to review the Welcome Center restrooms and use of both the Trinity Room and Luther Lounge. Members serving on the committee are Colin Barron, Jon Beatch, Lola Coon, Karon Gubbrud, Eric Severson, and Jean Hoff.

A celebration upon the completion of the sound and video systems will take place. A date is yet to be set for this celebration. Look for more information in the future.
