

Throughout the 50 days of Easter, paraments in the chancel point us to the good news of Christ's resurrection. The lectern fall during this season announces our Lord's victory over sin and death with a symbol of his death and resurrection. By the cross, our Lord grants forgiveness, and through the empty tomb, Jesus is raised for our justification. This is God's glory and victory, for Christ now reigns over all things.

Prelude: This weekend familiar Scripture readings from Psalm 23 and John 10 provide our focus on Christ, the Good Shepherd. Across three settings by American composers, we hear familiar melodies, which help us sing the same Psalm.

Entrance Hymn: This Easter hymn reminds us the Good Shepherd we know is also the "Lamb" who "bled for the sheep." Christ comes to contend against death itself, that we might dwell in the house of the Lord forever!



he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.





Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses,






