

Throughout the 50 days of Easter, paraments in the chancel point us to the good news of Christ's resurrection. The lectern fall during this season announces our Lord's victory over sin and death with a symbol of his death and resurrection. By the cross, our Lord grants forgiveness, and through the empty tomb, Jesus is raised for our justification. This is God's glory and victory, for Christ now reigns over all things.

Prelude: This brief setting of the familiar hymn "Good Christian Friends, Rejoice and Sing" announces our Lord's victory over death with full organ.

Entrance Hymn: This bold Lutheran chorale written for Easter proclaims the good news of this season—"[Christ] who is strong to save has triumphed o'er the grave!" Because of Christ, we are safe from all evil and laugh in the face of sin and death. This gift of life belongs to us today!

Confession and Forgiveness

Silence for reflection.



Word of God, Word of Life. Thanks be to God.

First Reading: While Peter shares the good news of Jesus with a Gentile soldier and his family, the Holy Spirit comes upon them. Recognizing that the Spirit works inclusively in the lives of both Jews and Gentiles, Peter commands that these Gentiles also be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ.

Second Reading: God's children believe that Jesus is the Messiah and love God by keeping God's commandments. Thus the world is conquered not through military might but through love and faith.



Nicene Creed

With the whole church, let us confess our faith.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,

We look for the resurrection of the dead,

How can we not know our God? How can we not love our God? He sent His only Son to die for all our sins. Is there greater love than this? Beloved, if this is how God loves,


then we should love all men, and live in perfect harmony with all, and God will live in us.



The Lord's Prayer


- Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, let us pray as Jesus taught us.
