Capital Campaign Update

At a meeting with the architect and the construction company, a tentative start date of November 14 was provided for the Atrium remodel to begin. You will notice all of the items normally in the Atrium have been moved. The donation boxes for Food to You and Necessities for Neighbors are located in the Gathering Room. The donation box for Church on the Street is now located outside their office.

The contractor will be working from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. Mondays, Tuesdays,

Thursdays, and Fridays. On Wednesdays, the construction will end at 4 p.m. to get the Atrium cleaned up for Wednesday evening activities. The contractor will try to limit disruptions, but there are bound to be some along the way. People will be notified as soon as possible about any disruptions that will impact them. If a funeral is scheduled, no construction work will be done that day.

A wheel chair is located in the area as you head down to the Friendship Room with the door that leads to the outside.

The coat rack in the Atrium will be

removed by the construction company. Please use the coat racks in the Welcome Center or in Reformation Hall.

Please recognize that the construction team in the building can't change anything as they are governed by the contract with the church. The church will keep you updated to what is happening on the remodel project as we move forward.

The tuck pointing project has been completed. This was a great project that will help to protect the brick and the interior of the church.

December Special Offering

This month's special offering supports The Furniture Mission, The Banquet, and Center of Hope.

The Furniture Mission's purpose is to demonstrate the love of Christ by doing his will in providing those in need with gently used furniture and household items. A comfortable home provides dignity, security, and a better environment in which to raise a family. Each person or family who receives furniture is referred by a social service agency, school, church, or hospital. Pre-qualifying assures we are serving those truly in need. This mission is composed of mostly volunteers who carry out the day-to-day operations of pickup/delivery, necessary cleaning/repair, warehouse organization, and clerical work. A Board of Directors volunteers their time and expertise to assure the mission

stays true to its calling to be an effective, efficient, and accountable organization. Each household receiving furniture also receives a copy of the Holy Bible along with information about study groups and an invitation to attend.

The Banquet's mission is to provide a welcoming place where people in the community can gather, receive nourishment, and feed the body and spirit. This ministry provides assistance to volunteers from Sioux Falls and surrounding areas in providing food and fellowship to those served. The Banquet meal ministry was founded in 1985 starting with just one meal per week. It now serves 16 meals per week at two locations in Sioux Falls and is a volunteerbased ministry, which means the meals are paid for, prepared by, and served by volunteer groups.

Center of Hope's mission is to walk alongside people, bringing them spiritual and physical health, and ultimately changing our community one life at a time. Their philosophy is to help people help themselves, encouraging them through their struggles and celebrating their victories. This mission is in need of prayer, winter and seasonal clothing, volunteers, and financial assistance to move people from dependency to self-sufficiency. Center of Hope provides computers for job searches and applications, phones for long-distance calls, bicycles to qualifying families and individuals for transportation and recreation, faith-based nursing care, pastoral care, and Bible studies for men and women.

December Awareness: Human Trafficking and How You Can Help

This December the Care and Health Board is focusing on the care and support of persons who have been affected by human trafficking.

Although human trafficking may seem like a problem that occurs far from our doorstep, the reality is that human trafficking is the fastest-growing criminal industry and affects every nation, including the US. Human trafficking is defined as "the illegal trade of human beings, mainly for the purposes of forced labor and sex trafficking," and has been steadily increasing in recent years.

Presently, there are more slaves in the world than at any other point in history, and it is estimated that every 30 seconds someone becomes a victim of human

trafficking. Unfortunately, many survivors of human trafficking lack access to services and specialized care, but thankfully, Sioux Falls is home to Call to Freedom, which acts as a resource for survivors.

"Call to Freedom provides supportive

services for victims of human trafficking and sexual exploitation by creating a strong network of front line providers



who offer safe housing, counseling, medical assistance, transportation, and other supportive services."

First Lutheran Church is grateful for the

Council Highlights: October 2022

- The call committee has recommended Pr. Jason Burggraff as the next senior pastor of FLC. Pr. Jason will visit Wednesday, November 2.
- Two new members were approved: Mitchell and Kristen Peterson.
- Budget congress will be held at the November council meeting as council prepares for 2023.
- The worship and music board briefly discussed the return of News Notes. The board believed the congregation needs to better be made aware of the change from News Notes to FLC Now. The ushers will help direct congregants to these documents (located outside all sanctuary and chapel entrances) at worship.
- The welcome and community board will be returning a new, improved pew pad to the pews. They are also creating a guest center to better identify guests in worship.
- All boards have board member openings. Council members were asked to give suggested names to Barney Brandenburg and the nominating committee.
- YTD revenue is down about \$48k, YTD expenses are down about \$138k. Overall, revenue still exceeds expenses, so finances are good overall.
- The contract for deed was paid off as of October.
- Atrium construction will begin Monday, November 14.
