


New Staff to Kick Off 2022

Thanks be to God for the many gifts that were received from the members of First Lutheran that retired the debt of the HVAC loan! The first goal of the campaign has been completed. We still have four goals, outlined below, that need to be funded. With the exception of the tuck pointing, the goals are

listed in no particular order.

Tuck pointing of the bell tower and north side of the church building: The cost is \$121,000, and a contract has been signed so the work can begin in the spring. This project was determined to be the number one project by the Church Council. We are confident that with the pledges that are to come in the first five months of the year, we will have the money to pay for this project when the work begins. The property board also has some reserve funds that could help pay for the project should the campaign fall short.

Atrium remodel at a cost of approximately \$160,000: If you attended previous campaign meetings, you are aware there is a need to move the reception desk so the receptionist has a greater sight line to see who is coming into the building. This makes it easier for visitors to know where to find the receptionist, and it provides greater safety for the visitors, members, and staff. We do have \$100,000 designated toward this project.

Sanctuary ceiling: This project is the largest project and has increased in cost since the campaign began. The original cost was estimated at \$650,000. Construction costs have increased significantly due to COVID. After discussion with contractors that specialize in these types of projects, the cost is now estimated at \$750,000.

Sanctuary sound system: This is the final project approved by the Church Council to be completed under the God's Grace: Our Heritage and Future Capital Campaign. The approximate cost of this project is \$250,000. For this project, we have received pledges that total \$100,000 and non-pledge money of \$7,500.

We do not have enough in pledges to complete these four necessary projects, and we are looking to the congregation to help us raise the money/pledges to complete them. Please prayerfully consider how you might help.



Council Highlights: December 16, 2021

If First Lutheran members wish to add items to an upcoming Council meeting agenda, please contact Jodi Hoyt, jhoyt@flcsf.org. Meetings are held the fourth Thursday of each month. Church members are welcome to visit meetings.

- We ended the month positive for November, bringing us to +\$75,550 for the year. Offerings are still down approximately \$150k for the year. Total income is below budget \$167k for the year. Personnel numbers continue to be below budget for the year, which provides savings and allows budget numbers to be positive.
- This week we welcomed Pr. Dave Zellmer and our new office manager, Sarah Maag.
- Pr. Jeff shared that we've received a great number of requests for help in our community.
- Pr. Dave shared that historically, pandemics break cultures. He mentioned that a primary purpose of church leadership is to help the congregation remain calm. Pushes will be made for things to happen more quickly. The leadership can help ease those anxieties by leading with calmness.
- The HVAC balance is now \$38,228. Jean is still optimistic that the loan will be paid in full by the end of the year.
- With Dr. Steve Paulson ending his time at Luther House mid academic year, it was decided that this year's donation would be \$25k (vs. \$50k as originally planned)

"For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me." -Matthew 25:35

The most recent statistics show that there are more than 1,000 homeless adults and more than 700 homeless children in the Sioux Falls area.

This month's special offering envelope supports three local missions that provide crisis support to people in our community experiencing poverty or homelessness: Union Gospel Mission, Bishop Dudley House, and St. Francis House.

Union Gospel Mission

Union Gospel Mission started in Sioux Falls in 1900 and for 121 years has provided spiritual nourishment, housing, meals, clothing, and



household items to needy folks in our community. The Mission provides safe, comfortable lodging and showers for individuals who find themselves without shelter and needing a place to rest and get out of the elements. Lodging is offered for up to 80 men and 48 women and children. Guests might be transients passing through the area; some are people struggling as they work to get back on their feet, and a few others are individuals that choose to join our discipleship program and become accountable in several areas of their life.

In addition to providing three meals a day, UGM also provides daily chapel, adult learning, medical care, and

Bishop Dudley House

Bishop Dudley Hospitality House is an ecumenical ministry in Sioux Falls that provides a central, first-stop resource for those in crisis.

Bishop Dudley Hospitality House offers daytime and overnight emergency shelter for those who find themselves homeless and vulnerable, housing some 80 men, 20 women, and 7 families nightly. Like Union Gospel Mission, their programming serves the holistic needs of the individual. The Bishop Dudley Hospitality House offers a warm, safe, secure place to start the road back to a more stable, long-term way of living.

St. Francis House

St. Francis House is an emergency and transitional housing program for up to 120 men and women and seven families. St. Francis House began as an ecumenical partnership between First Lutheran Church and the Sioux Falls Catholic Diocese in 1987. The primary mission of SFH is to move people from homelessness to hope.

Besides providing housing for those in need, SFH provides three meals each day as well as case management services to assist guests with obtaining and maintaining employment, attending treatment classes, rebuilding their relationships with family, and paying off their debts to society.



SFH requires guests to obtain and maintain employment. Guests are required to place every paycheck into a savings account. While at the House, guests must remain alcohol, substance, and gambling free; perform household chores; and attend two self-improvement classes each week.

SFH provides guests with shelter, food, debt management, basic essentials, case management, and HOPE! Visit stfrancishouse.com to learn more.
