November Special Offering

This month's special offering supports Pueblo de Dios and Vecinos Unidos—Spanish faith communities in Sioux Falls.

Pueblo de Dios, translated "People, or Community, of God," is a mission ministry developed under the SD Synod of the ELCA. This congregation is the first Spanish-speaking Lutheran congregation in Sioux Falls with members who have come from Mexico as well as Central and South America.

While you may recognize **Pueblo de Dios** as the organization that occasionally sells tamales, they are so much more!
Pueblo de Dios was birthed at First

Lutheran Church, then moved to share space with Augustana Lutheran in the Cathedral historic neighborhood. Pastor Maria Cabello Solomon currently serves as the full-time pastor of Pueblo de Dios. The congregation meets weekly to worship together in Spanish and is a positive presence in supporting the Latinx community in Sioux Falls. You are always invited to attend a festive worship at 12:30 p.m. each Sunday at Augustana Lutheran (235 North Prairie Avenue).

Amidst all of the celebrations, activities, and food, the principal mission of Pueblo de Dios is to share the love that Christ shows us and teach people to be disciples of Jesus Christ like we learn from the gospel of Matthew.

Vecinos Unidos (VU), formerly Ayuda, translated as "Neighbors United," is a closely related initiative and is a partnership supported by the ELCA congregations of Sioux Falls. The VU

group helps to establish relationships between the people of Pueblo de Dios and the other predominantly Anglo-Lutheran churches in Sioux Falls. In addition to selling tamales, volunteers are encouraged to help with the Logos program at Pueblo, which is their version of church school on Wednesday nights. They also have a language partners program where an English-speaking person is paired with a Spanish-speaking person, and they learn each other's language.

If you have always wanted to learn Spanish, join this amazing ministry. VU also looks to provide pathways for people seeking asylum and helps the recently emigrated find pathways to establish a life here in Sioux Falls.

Please prayerfully consider financially supporting these important local ministries. Your offering makes a difference in the lives of our Latinx neighbors.

Council Highlights: September 2022

- Discussion was had regarding the atrium remodel. Some members expressed concern that the sheetrocking wasn't clear. Concern was shared in covering the brick and Gathering Room kitchen windows.
- Discussion was had on securing the main entrance throughout the week (during office hours).
- Atrium remodel bids were presented and discussed. The bid was about \$70k above the original estimate.
- The design for the new Sanctuary sound system will hopefully be received by the end of the year.

- Pledge payments are down for the year.
