CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

God's Grace: Our Heritage and Future Capital Campaign

Things are progressing well on the 3 projects that the Church Council choose as priorities for the capital campaign. Those 3 priorities are the tuck pointing, the



sound system and the Atrium. The 4th item of importance to our congregation is the 10% that goes to missions.

The tuck pointing began on August 3. The bell tower has the most extensive work to be completed. You will note that there will be scaffolding set up in order to do the work on the bell tower. The grinding of the mortar in many places on the church has begun as well. Please pray for the team of people that will be doing this work. It is hard work and the weather is always a factor.


The process for the sound system began before the capital campaign started by James Moore and the Worship and Music board. This group began working with a sound system designer and they are continuing with this work. We are waiting for some information on the design and then will be seeking bids on the sound system.

The third project is the Atrium remodel. As you all know, there is concern for the safety of the receptionist in an area where they have no escape route should they need to get out of the reception area. For many years, the Sioux Falls Police Department, has indicated that the church should make a change. In another article you will see pictures of what the

project will look like upon completion. There is still need for some funding for this project. Would you prayerfully consider a gift for the campaign? The mission component of the campaign has received a total of \$116,770.72. This component will continue to receive money based on the money given to the campaign by the congregation. There is an additional project that funds are needed for and that is the sanctuary ceiling. We estimate that this is a cost of \$750,000. However, the longer this project is put off, the more costly it might become to the congregation. Again, please pray about this project and what you might be able to give to help provide a new ceiling in the sanctuary. Atrium Remodel First Look

There have been many meetings throughout the summer on the Atrium remodel project. I hope you will enjoy seeing the renderings of the Atrium remodel reflected in this article. The bid process began on August 15 and will close on September 14. The bids will be opened on September 15 here at First Lutheran. The bids will then be brought before the church council at the September 22 Church Council meeting and a decision on the contractor will be made. After a contractor is chosen, then the time frame of when the work will start and be completed will be shared with the congregation. There is a desire to get the project started immediately so that as we approach Thanksgiving, Advent and Christmas, the construction would be completed. Yes, there will be some disruption during the week when the construction crew is working but we hope to minimize that for the weekends. Yes, this may cause some inconveniences and there will be areas that will be blocked off. Please know that the staff will do all they can to help with issues during the construction. Care & Health board to support Alzheimer's Awareness Month

September is Alzheimer's Awareness month. The current estimate for the US population is that approximately 5.8 million people suffer from some form of dementia. In SD, the



number is now at approximately 18,000. Dementia is an umbrella term which includes Alzheimer's disease, vascular dementia, mixed dementia, Lewy-Body dementia, and Fronto-Temporal dementia. There are additional types of dementia which occur with other disease states such as Normal Pressure Hydrocephalus and Parkinson's disease. Of these types of dementia, Alzheimer's disease is the most prevalent. There are approximately 16 million dementia care givers in the US at this time. The cost of giving care has been estimated at \$290 billion dollars per year. But that just speaks to the economic costs. There are immeasurable costs to caregivers. The physical strains and the

emotional toll is nearly impossible to gauge.

For that reason, the Care and Health Board of FLC has undertaken a caregiver support group. The purpose of the support group is to meet the basic central needs of dementia care partners. Those needs include:

Telling and retelling your story.
Educating yourself about the disease type of dementia

3) Learning to adapt to a changing relationship with your partner4) Allowing time to grieve the losses brought about by the disease

5) Learning about the importance of taking care of yourself

6) Learning to ask for and accept help from others

7) Preparing for what may come in the future due to disease progression8) Exploration of spiritual and existential questions to help find meaning and purpose.

We are using as our guide the "Dementia Care-Partner's Workbook" written by Dr. Edward Shaw, MD, MA. We are currently meeting monthly and have anywhere from 8-14 participants. Each participant has been given a copy of the book, and we typically spend between 60-90 minutes in discussion each month.



The group has had many interesting discussions and has grown closer as a result of their interactions. Because September is Alzheimer's Awareness month, the SD chapter of the Alzheimer's Association is sponsoring a fundraising walk on September 17 at the Levitt at the Falls. It begins with registration at 8:30 (although online registration is available) and an opening ceremony at 10:00. The walk will follow. The FLC Care and Health Board would like to get a team to walk in support of this mission this year.
